The Burnside Symphony Orchestra

The Burnside Orchestra, founded in 1956, is an amateur orchestra. It is supported by the City of Burnside Council and performs in aid of various charity organisations. Past conductors of the orchestra have been scientist John Black, flautist David Cubbin, violinists Robert Cooper, James Ferguson and Alphonse Anthony, oboist Bruce Stewart and cellist David Sharp. The orchestra's current conductor is Martin Butler.

Martin Butler

Martin Butler was born in London and began learning violin at the age of eight. When he was eleven Martin received a scholarship to the Guildhall School of Music. After leaving school he studied composition at Surrey University, graduating with a First Class Honours and Masters Degree. After a spell as a keyboard player in a rock band, Martin moved to Portugal where he played violin in the 'Teatro Nacional de Sao Carlos' in Lisbon. In Portugal he also pursued many other musical interests including ensemble, gypsy and jazz. During his last year in Portugal Martin began playing viola in the orchestra. In 1990 he joined the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra.

Martha Jahangiri

Martha Jahangiri was born in 1950 in Zahedan, Iran. She studied music at the Conservatorium and the University of Tehran, receiving a Bachelor of Music in 1975. She then joined the Centre for the Preservation and Propagation of Persian Traditional Music. Martha was then trained in the fundamental aspects of modern and cultural Persian music. She later qualified as an instrumental and theory teacher, also devoting her time to research and consultation with experts on the twelve Persian Dastgaha and Gooshe-ha. Martha has performed as a soloist and toured with orchestras in many countries in Asia, Africa and Europe including the Cultural and Fine Arts Orchestra and Maurice Bejarts Ballet. She is now living in Australia with her husband and two daughters. In Adelaide she has performed Santur to a variety of audiences at Edmond Wright Hall, Elder Hall, the Burnside and Norwood Town Halls, TAFE College, University of SA and at the Planetarium Proms. In Iran she was the student of Mr H Dehlavi and Mr F Payvar, the brilliant and gifted figures of Persian music. The Concertino for Santur and Orchestra was composed by Mr Dehlavi and Mr Payvar and is being performed for the first time by the Burnside Symphony Orchestra.
