

# Orchestra To Perform Prize Work

"Still Waters," an orchestral composition by Clifford Phillips which won "The Advertiser" Prize offered through the Burnside Symphony Orchestra this year, will be included in the orchestra's Fifth Birthday Concert in the Burnside Town Hall tomorrow night.

The conductor will be Dr. John Black, founder of the orchestra.

Now 63 strong, including five horns, three trumpets, four trombones and two harps, this is the largest orchestra that Adelaide has ever possessed, to my knowledge.

Its repertoire is equally remarkable, Dr. Black having made a point of performing unhackneyed classics, with a leavening of lighter numbers.

One of his great loves being opera, he has done what he could to give singers a chance to sing operatic arias with full orchestral accompaniment.

That such enterprise should have attracted such powerful backers as Burnside City Council and "The Advertiser" is a happy augury of future success.—
