PROGRAMME NOTES

1. 'Fingal's Cave' Overture from "The Hebrides" by Felix Mendelssohn (1809 - 1847)
The Hebrides Overture is considered by some to be the finest

The mentions overture is considered by some to be the finest orchestral work by this composer. It was written as a result of Mendelssohn's reaction to the amesom power of the Morth Atlantic Ocean and Soctland's northern constline. It reflects the Romantic artists' attraction to 'nature in the raw'.

Mendelsoohn is the composer of the Romantic period whose work mostly recalls the split of the preceding classical style. Always imbured with a sense of immonse control and grace, his music rarely becomes highly charged in an emotional way. It does, however, have a quiet power and mystique of its own.

Piano Concerto No. 1 in E flat major by Franz Liszt (1811-1886)

The Piano Concorto in E flat major was not completed for almost 20 years. It was constantly changed and revised until its first performance. The relationship between piano and orchestra in this work is a dramatic one. The piano isa character at times in dialogue with the exchestra, at other times in conflict.

Frans Liest represented the full range of the romantic spirit, both as a composer and as a performer. He was an extraordinary swsician and was offted with a fieru plane technique.

3. The Karelia Suite by Jean Sibelius (1865 - 1957).

Karelia, resplendent with lakes and pine forrests, is one of Finland's most besutiful regions. Sibelius had a special relationship with this area as he spent his honeymoon there. The Suite was originally written to accompany a play, and is in] movements: Intermose, ballade and Alla Marcia.

4. La Calinda bu Frederick Delius (1862 - 1934).

Little is known about La Calinda, but it is reflective of the composer's distinctive surjet. Delius was an Daylish composer whose musical temperament was well developed early on in life, He studied under Jadassohn and Riencke at the Leiping Conservatory. He wrote as the spirit moved him, and his composition followed no particular order.

5. The Nerry Miyes of Mindeor (Ne Leasing Misbern von Mindeor) is of diff" composition. It is thought to have been competed by Franz von Suppe (16.7) - 1895), an Austrian composer whose associations with theater and operatic music were very stone, but it has also been attributed to Micolai (1810 - 1893).
