WAGNER - Flying Dutchman Overture

This is the dramatic opening to Wagner's opera about a ship's captain, Daland, who is condemned to remain forever at sea.

SAINT-SAENS - Danse Macabre

This tone poem for orchestra, written in 1874, was inspired by a legend in which Death appears at midnight every year on Halloween and calls forth the dead to dance for him while he plays his fiddle. The skeletons dance for him until the rooster crows at dawn, when they must return to their graves until the next year.

HUMPERDINCK - Witches Ride

This interlude is from the fairy-tale opera Hansel and Gretel, about two children who are placed under a spell by a witch and must trick her in order to escape.

MUSSORGSKY - Baba Yaga

Also known as The Hut on Hen's Legs, this piece from *Pictures at an Exhibition*, depicts Baba Yaga, an old crone from Eastern European mythology. Originally a piano composition, we are playing Maurice Ravel's 1922 adaptation for symphony orchestra.

DEBUSSY - Prélude à l'après-midi d'une faune

This is one of Debussy's most famous works, composed and first performed in 1894. It is a musical evocation of Stéphane Mallarmé's poem *Afternoon of a Faun*, in which a faun—a half-man, half-goat creature of ancient Greek legend—awakes to revel in sensuous memories of forest nymphs.

STRAVINSKY - Rondo of the Princesses

This piece from *The Firebird Suite*, a ballet and orchestral work, describes the journey of Prince Ivan and his meeting with thirteen princesses who have been placed under a spell.

MUSSORGSKY - Night on Bald Mountain

Inspired by a Russian legend, this piece depicts a witches' sabbath taking place on St John's Night (23–24 June) on the Lysa Hora (Bald Mountain) near Kiev.
