Martin Butler was born in London and began learning violin at the age of eight. When he was eleven Martin received a scholarship to the Guildhall School of Music. After leaving school he studied composition at Surrey University, graduating with a First Class Honours and Masters Degree. After a spell as a keyboard player in a rock band, Martin moved to Portugal where he played violin in the Testro Nacional de Sao Carlos' in Lisbon. In Portugal he also pursued many other musical interests including ensemble, grays and jazz. During his last year in Portugal Martin began playing viola in the orchestra. In 1990 he joined the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra.

Nicolina Fragnito - Soprano

Nicolina Fragnito - Soprano Nicolina Fragnito completed her Advanced Diploma of Music (Performance) in 1998 and Bachelor of Music Degree (Performance) in 1999 at the Flinders Street School of Music. In 2000 she went on to achieve first class honours at the Conservational Adelaide University. Nicolina was awarded a distinction for both her Advanced Diploma and Bachelor of Music recitals

Nicolina was the national finalist for the Australian National Association of Teachers of Singing competition in 1997. She has also won several prizes at the Adelaide Eisteddfod Society and was the semi-finalist in the 1999 birov Award broadcasted live on ABC Classic FM. In late 1999 Nicolina was the winner of the Adlans competition. She has also won the Adelaide Chamber Orrehestral TAWARD as the most outstanding graduate of the Bachelor of Music (Performance).

At the beginning of 1998, she performed in her first opera for the Gilbert and Sullivan Society, *The Gondollers*, playing the minor principal role of Guila. Later in the year she was selected to perform her concerto work with the Adelaide Youth Orchestra. Nicolina also played the role of the Countess in *The Marriage of Figura* of the convincing portrayal and clear voice capitivated the audience and critics alike.

Later this year Nicolina will sing in the State Opera chorus in the opera Andrex Chenier. While Nicolina is opera trained she embraces other musical styles such as jazz and Latin. As well as teaching Nicolina sings in lounge bars, restaurants weddings, funerals, corporate gigs and cultural celebrations.

Tasso has performed in opera throughout Australia and New Zealand and most recently performed at the 2000 Lygon Street Festival, Melbourne, 2000 Estia Groek Festival, Hobart and at the 1997 World Arts Festival in Thessaloniki, Greece.
